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Why study English Extension?

The English Extension 1 course provides students who undertake Advanced English and are accomplished in their use of English with the opportunity to extend their use of language and self-expression in creative and critical ways.

Students have the opportunity to pursue areas of interest with increased independence and to theorise about the processes of responding to and composing texts.

The course is designed for students with an interest in literature and a desire to pursue specialised study of English.



Year 11 Course Topics

40 Hours

Related Research Project– 20 Hours

Text Requirements

Teachers prescribe ONE text from
the past and its manifestations in
one or more recent cultures

Students select ONE text and its
manifestations in one or more
recent cultures. Students research
a range of texts as part of their
independent project.



Year 12 Course Topics

Common module 60 Hours: Literary Worlds with
ONE elective option

Text Requirements

The study of at least THREE texts must be se-
lected from a prescribed text list for the module
study including at least TWO extended print texts

Students are required to study at least TWO re-
lated texts
