Year 11 Course

In the Year 11 course here are 3 sections:

1A - The Nature of Modern History.

This includes studying how history is told and how understandings of history change over time. We study topics such as History Through Film and Constructing Modern History.



1B - History Case Studies

This unit includes studying a range of case studies in depth. The options could include:

Year 12 Course

In the Year 12 course there are 4 sections:

Core Study: Power and Authority 1919-1946 (the rise and fall of the Nazis and other dictatorships in Europe)

- What impact did this have on Germany and the world?





National Studies: China 1927 - 1949 - The nature, causes and impact of the Chinese

- In what ways did the end of World War 2 influence the growth in support for communism?

- Studies in Peace and Conflict: The Cold War 1945-1991
- The origins, development and nature of the Cold War.
- How and why did this conflict return to peace?
- Change in the Modern World: The Nuclear
