The central concern of Society and Culture Stage 6 is the interaction of persons, societies, cultures, environments and time.

Society and Culture draws on cross-disciplinary concepts and social research methodologies from anthropology, communication, cultural studies, media studies, philosophy, psychology, social ecology and sociology.

The study of Society and Culture involves students working individually and with others in practical and interactive activities that are related to the theoretical concepts in this course. Society and Culture provides students with skills to be able to critically analyse complementary and contrasting viewpoints about people, societies, culture and environment.

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


SOCIETY AND CULTURE
